CSI: Community Safety Initiative Overview & Ranking Summary

On Thursday, October 25, 2007, a community forum on safety and crime was held in Fort Dodge. Approximately 100 people attended this event to provide insight, and to help prioritize solutions to make Fort Dodge a safer community. The following is a ranking summary of solutions for the highest priority initiatives.

Question 1: What should we do to address our perception and reputation problem? Solutions (in order of popularity):

- Develop a positive image presentation, focusing on "good statistics" and the good things happening in neighborhoods
- Work on drug problem
- Get tough on drugs
- Provide police with everything they need for the job
- Positive marketing program

Question 2: How do we reduce our high crime rates?

- Neighborhood watch 'with teeth'
- Curfew
- Reactivate neighborhood watch programs
- Creative activities for youth after school
- Increase resource officers for schools

Question 3: How can we resolve our higher rate of social problems that have a direct or indirect effect on crime?

- Restore mental health services
- Provide education regarding self-esteem issues (character)
- Establishment of school police resource officer
- Reinstate DARE program or similar public service program for drug & alcohol prevention utilizing volunteers
- Youth programs in all levels of education
- Teen abstinence

Question 4: How do we help to make our smaller-than-average law enforcement staff more effective?

- Coordinate and cross train staff of police and fire
- More citizen involvement/reserve police officers
- Restructure priorities of officer's duties
- Use of criminal justice students for lower level deterrent jobs
- Dissolve bureaucracy from law enforcement staff & more inter-agency cooperation
